


Winlink Tip of the Month

- For ARDOP Peer-to-Peer Winlink practice on HF
- Use the following frequency for this practice
 - 3570 KHz (Dial frequency) with a 3571.5 KHz (Center frequency)
 Upper Side Band
- Send test messages to the following stations/addresses
 - NC9IL (State AUXCOM station)
 - KC9PHK (Flora EOC)
 - WB9QPM (Shelbyville)
 - K9LJB (Springfield) [offline until after Hamvention]
 - W9DSR (Aurora) Weekdays and Evenings
- Some are personal stations and will not be on the air due to NTS traffic nets, severe weather, or other conflicts. Repeated attempts may be needed.




Amateur Radio is High Tech!
